

VIDEOMANAGER: HOW TO WATCH VIDEOS AND RECORDINGS

PREREQUISITES

This document assumes that:

- You are an administrator who is familiar with the VideoManager system already.
- You have already connected body-worn cameras to VideoManager.
- You have already configured users, roles, and groups.

DEFINITION OF VIDEOS AND RECORDINGS?

Recordings are the complete footage recorded by a body-worn camera, from the moment it is prompted to start recording until the moment it is prompted to stop (including any pre- and post-record periods). They consist of a series of shorter videos, the length of each depending on how the body-worn camera's device profile has been configured. For example, a 1-hour long recording may be divided into 4 separate 15-minute videos, for ease of review.


HOW DO I TRANSFER RECORDINGS FROM MY BODY-WORN CAMERA TO VIDEOMANAGER?

VideoManager automatically offloads your body-worn camera recordings while your camera is charging in its charging dock. Some models of camera can also offload recordings over Wi-Fi where available and configured, when powered (VT-series) or when recordings are bookmarked (VB-series).


HOW DO I WATCH VIDEOS AND RECORDINGS ON VIDEOMANAGER?

To review videos and recordings on VideoManager:

- Navigate to the **Videos** tab.
- In the **Search Videos** pane, filter the videos as necessary, and click **Find Videos**.



- Next to the relevant video, click >.
- Click the **Play Video** button. 



- Click **Settings**. The **Playback Controls** menu will open.

- In the **Playback Controls** menu, you can perform the following actions:
 - **Play** - plays or pauses the video.
 - **Step Backward** - steps backwards through footage one frame at a time.
 - **Step Forward** - steps forward through footage one frame at a time.
 - **Keyboard Shortcuts** - lists keyboard shortcuts that users can take.
 - **Date / Time Overlay** - displays or hides the date and time the video was recorded.
 - **Audio** - turns audio on or off for the video.
 - **Take Screenshot** - take a screenshot of the video in playback. Screenshots are automatically downloaded to your PC.
 - **Video Quality** - changes the quality of the video in playback. The default video quality setting is low. It is recommended that the highest setting is only used if there is a good data transfer connection.
- To put the video in theater mode, click **Theater**. The video will be maximized to fill the entire active window - click **Theater** again to return the video to its original size.
- To put the video in **Fullscreen** mode, click Fullscreen. The video will be maximized to fill the entire screen - click **Fullscreen** again to return the video to its original size.

HOW DO I WATCH RECORDINGS IN VIDEOMANAGER?

To watch a whole recording, you can add any video from a recording to an event, and VideoManager offers to collect all the videos together - this then becomes a clip in the event, and you can use the same controls player. You can also use the event clip tools to select a smaller section of the whole recording.
